"I was born, about seven, eight miles west of Concordia, not far from Scottsville," says Marilyn. "The exciting thing for my mother was not only was I a breech birth, I was a

frank breech birth, and I weighed nine pounds. My poor mother, what kept her alive, I don't know," she says.

Eventually Marilyn's family moved to Concordia. "Not many people can brag that they were raised in a barn," she says. The barn, in fact, was an apartment next to the sale barn. Her family took it over until they bought a house.

Marilyn has one older sister who is a very accomplished musician and directed numerous musical comedies. Marilyn had



the pleasure of going to her shows for years. "I remember I went to Annie Get Your Gun, Hawaii, The Sound of Music, and Fiddler on the Roof," says Marilyn.

Marilyn has five children of her own. "I just loved raising kids," she says. Three of her boys have degrees in engineering from Kansas State University. Her daughter studied geology and has a degree from K-State, too.

Marilyn worked with another resident, Aline Luecke, at the Cloud County Historical Museum for several years. Marilyn volunteered at the museum because she enjoyed researching family history. "And so we started doing that and I got to know her better" Marilyn says. "Besides that, in high school I went with her brother. I don't know where that came from." she chuckles.

Marilyn also served on the library board, "I was proud to be asked to be on the library board, that was my kind of stuff." An avid reader, Marilyn used to read about five books a week. One of her favorite authors is James Patterson and she has read most of his books.

In the early 2000s, Marilyn was instrumental in the formation of a book to document the first 100 years of Sunset Home. For ten years, she also led residents in The News Forum Group. Each week they

They visited Scotland a few times and Marilyn was able to continue some of her genealogy quests. On their last trip, her husband Dean did not want to do anything too strenuous, and Marilyn

remembers him saying, "How would you feel about Ireland?

Everybody tells us how beautiful Ireland is." Even though it wasn't part of their genetic background, Marilyn agreed, "It was one of our favorite and it was our last trip together."

When thinking about a life well lived, "Not setting your goals too high," comes first to mind for Marilyn. "So many things are involved in that, your family, their battles, and their successes and so on are all such a part of it, and just how dependent we are on where they're at in their lives" she says. "I think I've been content most of my life. But I had difficulty when I lost Dean, it was hard to do. And he was so kind and so good and my kids loved him so much that we sure wouldn't have the same life if it hadn't been for him."
